One Child at a Time



God's Guiding Hand

The human cornerstone to the success of Bethania Kids ministry in India is the dedicated staff interacting with the children every day. All of our beautiful facilities and well planned programs would mean nothing without the right people to care about the physical, mental, emotional and spiritual welfare of each child. It is only through the close personal interactions with members of the staff that the children experience unconditional love, acceptance and compassion. Through the staff, they are able to heal and ultimately thrive.

We are often asked how we recruit the devoted staff members who care so lovingly for the children in our 18 homes, care centers and rehabilitation centers. How is it that the guiding hand of God leads us time and again to exactly the staff members we need at the time they are needed?

The Bethania Kids Foundation Board of Trustees in India, chaired by Dr. James Gnanakan, has designed recruitment protocols for both the administration level and the field level. In seeking the best candidates for various positions, they have combined both professionalism and spirituality, placing a high priority on finding individuals who are Christian and have demonstrated compassion for children. Because the salaries paid to Bethania Kids staff are relatively low, it has been an enormous challenge to find suitable candidates.

The Indian Board of Trustees makes use of various Christian and professional magazines in which to place recruitment advertisements as well as contacts with other NGOs (Non Government Organizations). But a recent experience reminded them in whom to ultimately place their trust for staffing issues. When the usual methods of recruitment failed to bring in suitable candidates, they made a concerted effort to focus on prayer, appealing to God for His merciful guidance and relying more on a Christian network for word-of-mouth recommendations.

With two important positions to fill, that Christian network proved to be invaluable as inquiries from qualified applicants began arriving. Isaac Eduman, who lived in Rajasthan in North India and worked for World Vision, was anxious to move to Batlagundu in South India to live with his wife and children, who were 1,860 miles away. It so happened that at that very time, Dayavu Home for Boys in Kannivadi (5 miles from Batlagundu) desperately needed a couple to manage this home. Both Isaac and his wife, Dhanalakshmi, had years of experience managing children's homes and in counseling/social work, so they were hired almost immediately. Soon their family (including their two children) moved into Dayavu Home for Boys, and it has been a mutually beneficial fit, thanks be to God.

Another very qualified staff member was a 25-yearold young woman who was recruited for the second position, that of project officer. The daughter of a

Christian family in Bangalore, she had just earned a post-graduate degree in social work from Mother Theresa University in Madurai and had come to the attention of our Bethania Kids Program Coordinators. After being interviewed and approved by the Board of Trustees and Board of Directors, she was hired and received training to oversee and coordinate the operations of all the Bethania Kids ministry sites.

Selva Saroja, now manager of Grace Home for Girls in Nagercoil, was another answer to a prayer when

Selvi Monikaraj died suddenly and the girls at Grace Home in Nagercoil were grief stricken at the loss of their "Amma." Selva had been a counselor to the girls for many years, so she was exactly the sensitive, understanding and qualified person needed to provide the kind of loving motherly care the girls so desperately needed.

In some cases, support staff members such as cooks or caregivers are not Christians initially but are led to Bethania Kids by dire financial needs. Such was the case with Mrs. Shanti, who has worked at Shalom Home for Girls as a cook for 14 years. Coming from a local Hindu family, her husband was unemployed

and she was fighting a losing battle to feed her three children. A friend brought her to Shalom Home to apply for a job as a cook. The result: she found fulfillment in feeding hungry girls who call her "aunty" and at the same time, she experienced profound joy in her newfound faith in a loving Lord.

Thus, Bethania Kids continues to rely on God's omniscience and compassion to help find dedicated staff members to care for our needy, neglected and rejected children in India. May God continue to smile on our ministry and lead the way.

Transfixed by the images of children on the screen as Josephine Selvan tells the stories of each of those children, the audience experiences the beauty and impact of God's work being done through Bethania Kids. After working with Bethania Kids for 25 years, Josephine knows every one of the children and women under our care in Kodaikanal. She tells of their pitiful conditions when they first came to Bethania Kids—malnourished, ill, abused, rejected, uncared for or simply on the edge of survival due to abject poverty. And then the grace of God becomes apparent as their lives are transformed.

Josephine arrived in the U.S. on September 26 and shared Bethania Kids ministry with our church partners and donors across the country through November 6. Board member Amy Pitts accompanied her as they traveled to 10 states and 15 cities. Their visits included long-time church partners in Silver Spring, MD, Ann Arbor, MI, and Winchester, VA, as well as first-time visits at St.

Bartholemew's Episcopal Church in Estes Park, CO, King of Glory Lutheran Church in Tempe, AZ, and St. Matthew's LC in North Hollywood, CA. In every location, Josephine touched hearts and made memories. Josephine will take home her own special memory as she experienced snow for the first time while in Colorado.

After each Tour of Love visit, audience members commented on how inspired they were by Josephine's witness to the powerful, positive impact Bethania Kids has made on the children, their families and their communities at large.
